recommendations. Your institution is expected to have improved on the relevant points by the time you start the activities funded by the Erasmus+ Programme.

Non-compliance with the assessors' recommendations, the principles of the Charter and the objectives of the Programme may result in the withdrawal of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education by the European Commission. The comments and recommendations of the assessors which have been analysed and endorsed by the European Commission are enclosed with this letter.

In order to apply for funding and participate in mobility and cooperation projects your institution needs to obtain a Participant Identification Code (PIC) from the Unique Registration Facility (URF). URF is a tool through which all legal and financial information related to your organisation will be managed.

We kindly ask you therefore to register in URF and send us the PIC attributed to you at your earliest convenience. Please note that **we can only issue your Charter once your PIC has been communicated to us.**


